Rules and Regulations

- At our insurance company's insistence, livestock exhibitors must provide proof of \$1,000,000 liability insurance or entries will have to be refused.
- Each Exhibitor must have purchased a 2008 Membership prior to the fair in order to exhibit. Memberships must accompany the entry form. Exhibitors that have not purchased a 2008 membership will not be permitted to exhibit.
- Judging will commence Saturday, August 9, 2008, at 10:00 am.
- All animals must be owned by and registered in the name of the exhibitor (breeding unit). The names, registration numbers and complete identification must be recorded on the entry forms. Exhibitors must present registration and flock health certificates (issued within 60 days of fair date) the day of the show.
- Entries are limited to one per section except that an exhibitor may make two entries in any two sections.
- Exhibitors may show in more than two classes.
- All animals must be tattooed and be accompanied by proof of having completed their Record of Performance (ROP). Spot-checking will be done.
- All sheep, whether owned by one person or more (individually or jointly), which are maintained on one farm, are considered to be the production of one farm or breeding unit.
- The seven breed classes to be shown on an individual breed basis are:
 - Breed 1 Suffolk Breed
 - Breed 2 Dorset
 - Breed 3 Hampshire
 - Breed 4 Leicester
 - Breed 5 North Country Cheviot
 - Breed 6 Oxford
 - Breed 7 Horned Dorsets
- Open Show.
- The Suffolk, Hampshire, Dorset and Oxford breeds must be shown in short fleece (staple less than 1 inch or 2.5 cm.). The Leicester and North Country Cheviot may be shown in long fleece.
- Luc adding a new one for classes with low entries – pending
- Entry fee will be 25% of total prize money awarded.
- Entries to be in the hands of the Secretary; Navan Fair, 1279 Colonial Road, Navan, ON K4B 1H8, by July 18, 2008
- Your attention is drawn to the fact that there must be at least 2 exhibitors in each breed of sheep classification to receive the prize money stated. Otherwise, one-half of the stipulated amount will be paid in any class to any exhibitor

Prizes - Prizes to be paid in Classes #1 through #4, in all Breeds.

1 st -\$45.00	6 th -\$15.00

Class #5 (Get of Sire) and Class #6 (Breeders Flock) will be paid to first 5 placings in all Breeds.

Classes

1. Ewe - Yearling: Two central permanent incisors. Second pair of permanent incisors may be fully up. Third pair of temporary incisors (milk teeth) must be firmly in place. Born and

- bred in Canada.
2. Ewe - Full Mouth Milk Teeth: First pair of temporary incisors must be in place. Born the property of the exhibitor
 3. Ram - Yearling: Two central permanent incisors. Second pair of incisors may be fully up. Third pair of temporary incisors (milk teeth) must be firmly in place.
 4. Ram - Full Mouth Milk Teeth: First pair of temporary incisors must be in place. Born the property of the exhibition
 5. Get of Sire - Born the property of the exhibitor. A group of three animals, full mouth milk teeth, by the same sire. Both sexes may be represented. Animals may or may not have been shown in previous classes.
 6. Breeders Flock - Bred and owned by exhibitor. A group of four animals. Both sexes to be represented. Each animal in the group must have been exhibited in one of the preceding classes. All animals in a group to be of one breed. The Registration Certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as breeder and as owner in both cases either as an individual or in partnership. In other words, the exhibitor may be a joint owner of an animal and/or the joint-breeder of an animal. Therefore, the animals must be:
 - (a) Owned and bred by the exhibitor, or,
 - (b) Jointly owned and bred by the exhibitor, or
 - (c) Owned and jointly bred by the exhibitor or,
 - (d) Jointly owned and jointly bred by the exhibitor.
 7. Champion Ram of Class and Reserve Champion Ram of Class – Ribbon only
 8. Champion Ewe of Class and Reserve Champion Ewe of Class – Ribbon only
 - (a) Grand Champion Ram of Show and Reserve Grand Champion Ram of Show.
 - (b) Grand Champion Ewe of Show Reserve Grand Champion Ewe of Show.
